Here are some Guugu Yimithirr PRESS PRESS words we will use for these activities.



To do these activities you need a **duuliir** that makes a black gamba and a bugul that makes a coloured gamba.



duuliir

We call a pencil a duuliir (charcoal), because we can draw a black line with a pencil like we can do with charcoal.



bugul

We call a crayon or a coloured pencil bugul (termite hill) because we ca colour things in with them like we can do with a piece of bugul.



thulnggala

Thulnggala means "You colour it in!". In the old days thulnggal meant "rub on" paint or salt. We use this word when we "rub on" colour with a crayon or pen.



We call a line that we draw on a paper a gamba (a track). So: Duuliirngun gamba yitharra wagurr wali gudaawi means: With a pencil, draw a line around the dog.
