

Here are some *Guugu Yimithirr* words we will use for these activities.

To do these activities you need a **duuliir** that makes a black **gamba** and a **bugul** that makes a coloured **gamba**.



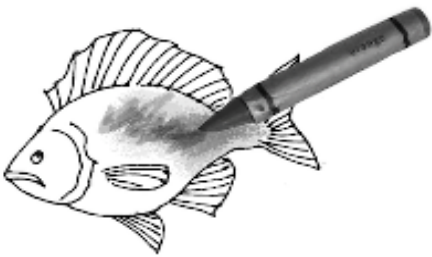
## duuliir

We call a pencil a **duuliir** (charcoal), because we can draw a black line with a pencil like we can do with charcoal.



## bugul

We call a crayon or a coloured pencil **bugul** (termite hill) because we can colour things in with them like we can do with a piece of **bugul**.



## thulnggala

**Thulnggala** means "You colour it in!". In the old days **thulnggal** meant "rub on" paint or salt. We use this word when we "rub on" colour with a crayon or pen.



## gamba

We call a line that we draw on a paper a **gamba** (a track). So: **Duuliirngun gamba yitharra wagurr wali gudaawi** means: With a pencil, draw a line around the dog.
